



# DISCLAIMER

This tutorial is simply how I do this makeup look! When practicing, if you find a better way to do something that results in the same look, go for it! Part 2 (the base makeup) can be done in any way you prefer to do. I'd also recommend doing the eye look *before* your base makeup, due to fallout and to minimize mistakes, but it is personal preference. Also remember that this makeup look can take 45 minutes-1 hour, so manage your time wisely.

## DISCLAIMER pt 2

If we have different eye shapes, the makeup I do on my eyes may not look the same as yours! Hooded eyelids or eyelids with not as much crease or lid space will require a little bit of tweaking. Try to adjust this to your eye shape, and ask me or Celeste if you are confused about anything or if something doesn't look quite right.





# PSA

When doing your eyeshadow, start with a little bit and build your way up. You can always add more, but it isn't always easy to go back. Also, **BLEND!!!!**

(My eyes sometimes do this weird thing where they don't close all the way, ignore it please LOL)

# EYESHADOW COLORS USED:

- A) Pooter
- B) Roxanne
- C) Jacz
- D) Chip
- E) S.B.N.
- F) Obsessed
- G) Queen
- H) Beam

If you don't own the Morphe palette, you can use any similar shades in another palette.



# ELF LIQUID GLITTER EYESHADOW (24K GOLD)



This year, along with the palette, we will need the ELF Liquid Glitter Eyeshadow in the shade 24K Gold. This retails from \$4-6 dollars and can be found at many stores both in person and online. This will add to our gold and glittery look!!!

## Step 1 (Prep)

Apply a layer of eye (or face) primer specifically around your eye area + at and above the crease area.

- This allows makeup to stay longer & be more opaque and vibrant

Then, follow with a thin layer of concealer. Evenly distribute with beauty blender/brush.



## Step 2, Pooter (A)

Using a flat, fluffy brush, apply shade Pooter around crease, concentrating on the inner and outer v of eye. Blend out well, and make sure the line isn't harsh/messy. Extend out from outer corner to make a triangle like shape.



## Step 3, Roxanne (B)

Repeat this step with Roxanne, using the same brush and applying to the same area. Make sure this is blended and directly layered over Pooter.



## Step 4, Jacz (C) + Chip (D)

With another fluffy brush, apply Jacz around crease, focusing on inner and outer corners. Your outer V should be the darkest, most concentrated part of your eye. Use a makeup wipe to clean up edge if needed.



## Step 5, CONCEAL

We will be doing a cut crease! I personally use eye paint, but concealer works just fine! Using a thin brush, apply concealer to your lid. If you have a strong double eyelid like me, tilt your head down, look up, then fill in the full space with concealer.

The outer corner is not as important, but make sure the inside is covered. The outer edge isn't important, but make sure the inner and top line are clean.



## Step 6, SBN (E)

With a flat eyeshadow brush, pack SBN into the lid space where the cut crease was made. You can apply setting spray to your brush before to get more pigment.



## Step 7, Obsessed (F)

With a flat eyeshadow brush, take Obsessed and apply to inner corner and inner lid. Blend this into SBN, and make sure there is a clear difference between the 2 shades. (It is a little hard to see in these pictures)



## Step 8, Queen (G)

With a smaller, rounder brush, apply Queen on top of your lid where SBN is. Avoid your inner lid and reapply Obsessed on inner lid if needed. Gold should be opaque, so apply setting spray to your brush before to get more pigment.



## Step 9, Jacz (C) + Chip (D)

With a fluffy brush, reapply Jacz and Chip to outer corner of eye, overlapping the end of Queen.



## Step 10, Beam (H)

With a small, flat brush, apply Beam to inner corner of eyes. Drag this up a little and blend with Obsessed.




## Step 11, Queen (G)

With a flat, angled brush, apply Queen under your waterline and into your lower lash line. Blend this into the beam in your inner corner. If messy, use a makeup wipe to cleanup. Apply setting spray to brush to get more pigment if needed. We want this as thin as possible.



## Step 12, ELF Liquid Glitter Eyeshadow (24K Gold)



With a thin, angled brush, apply the liquid eyeshadow to the end of the gold line previously drawn, extending out from the waterline.



## Step 13, ELF Liquid Glitter Eyeshadow (24K Gold)



Using the applicator, apply the liquid eyeshadow to center of lid.

Tap this around your eyelid with your finger. Try to avoid getting this above your crease and into your brow bone.



## **Step 14, Eyeliner**

Apply eyeliner on top of eyeshadow. Do not make this too thick that it covers the eye look, and make sure the eyeliner style you are doing suits your eye shape.

TIP: Use an eyeliner pen to get the shape, then reapply with liquid eyeliner for more opaque color and clean lines

## And you're done!




**This is the final eye look, apply some setting spray & your eyeshadow is complete.**

- With practice, your makeup will improve! Even this isn't my best work, but throughout the season it will get better.
  - Apply mass amounts of setting spray!!
- Now, we will move onto our base makeup.

# Step 1 (Primer)

Primer is applied before anything else! We need our makeup to last long, and on competition days we tend to sweat a lot. Skipping out on primer is a big no!



## Step 2 (Foundation)

Foundation is the “base” layer. Go for as full coverage as possible, and make sure it suits your skin type. Shade matching is also very important, it should be as close to your skin-tone as possible.

This comes in powder as well, but liquid foundation works better.



Apply foundation covering all areas of the face.

## **Step 3 (Concealer)**

Apply concealer under dark circle areas, cheeks, and any problem areas that you have.

Layer if needed. I personally conceal twice, once with a shade matching my skin, and once with a shade lighter.



## Step 4 (Setting Powder)

Apply setting powder to face after done with foundation and concealer. Dust over skin with a large, fluffy brush. You can also *bake* with setting powder, but it is up to personal preference.



This will both mattify your makeup + make your base last longer.

## Step 5 (Contour)

Using a darker than your skin tone contour powder or stick, apply to areas where you want depth. Re-apply concealer for highlighting, and blend well. Note: Different face shapes will require different contouring.

I contour along my forehead, cheekbones, jawline, and sides of my face. You can also bake with setting powder after this step.

## Step 6 (Blush)

Blush can come in liquid, powder, or cream forms. (If powder) With a fluffy brush, apply blush across cheeks. (If cream or liquid) Blend into base using either beauty blender or makeup brush. Don't make this too bright, but not too light either. Blush can really make your look 10x better.



I like applying blush along my nose bridge as well, but it's personal preference!

## **Step 8 (Lips)**

# Set, and you're almost done!!

I cannot express how important setting spray is!! Reapply after completing base and all of your face makeup is complete. The final step is to apply false eyelashes.

# FAKE EYELASHES



In guard, we always perform wearing fake eyelashes. You will need your lashes, mascara, eyelash curler, and eyelash glue.



- 1) Curl your *natural* eyelashes with an eyelash curler.
- 2) Apply a thin layer of mascara to your *natural* lashes before applying false ones.
- 3) Add a thin layer of eyelash glue to the band of your *fake* eyelash. Let this get tacky for 30-60 seconds.
- 4) Once tacky, apply *fake* eyelash above your *natural* lash.
  - Make this as close to your lash line as possible
  - Make sure each eyelash goes on the correct eye
- 5) After secure, apply another thin layer of mascara to bond fake and real lashes.  
(Steps 2 & 5 can be optional)


# LASHES DOs & DON'Ts

## STYLE

Please do not buy lashes that are very small, thin, or natural looking! You do not need the biggest and boldest lashes, this will cover your eyeshadow look. Aim for more dramatic, but not "too much."



- If your lashes are too long (lash band) cut it to fit your eye, it can irritate you if you don't
- Make sure your lashes are fully glued on!!
- Wear lashes that are comfortable for you, but still do the job
- There are several lash packs online on Amazon or Shein for very cheap & there is the 99 cents store that carries nice ones aswell, you don't need expensive ones!!

## **And you're done!**

If there are any other steps you'd like to take, do them now. You are now show ready, and your makeup should impress your audience! Look good, feel good!

# REMOVING MAKEUP

Make sure after we are done that you properly remove your makeup.

Failing to do so can result in irritated skin and acne. There are several makeup removing wipes, balms, and cleansers. I personally use makeup wipes and then cleanse my face with a face wash.



Tip! Apply a gob of Vaseline to eyeshadow look, then rub it into your eyelid to melt it all together before removing with a makeup wipe. This helps me so much when removing my eye makeup.
