

**Tustin High School  
1338 Colorguard Syllabus  
Fall Semester 2018**

**Course Description**

Colorguard members perform with flags, props, and ruffles along with the Marching Band. Colorguard performs at a variety of school related activities focused on dancing and spinning. As such, physical education credit is earned for this course.

**Course Requirements**

This class is an auditioned only class. Students must keep their grades up to stay in this class as stated in grade expectations. Students are required to attend all rehearsals and performances.

**Grading**

Students are responsible for maintaining their grade and sharing it with their parents. Grades will be updated weekly on Aeries. You will be evaluated in the following areas:

Performances	50%
Attendance and Participation	50%

**Performances**

Attendance at performances is a required part of your grade. There is no way to make up a public performance. Your absence from a performance not only affects you, but it affects the other students in the program. If a student is absent from a competition, it could have a direct impact on the group’s overall score.

The performance part of your grade is worth 50% of your overall grade. You will be given 100 points at the beginning of the semester. Students will lose points for the following reasons:

Being tardy	-2
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Being very tardy (10 minutes or more)	-2 to -5 points
Leaving before you are excused	-2 to -5 points
Inappropriate behavior	-2 to -20 points
Inappropriate dress	-2 to -5 points
An excused missed performance (with make-up assignment)	-0 points
An unexcused missed performance	-50 points

If you have any conflicts with the year’s schedule, it must be submitted in writing, using the absence form, to the Band Director no later than August 17th, 2018. The Band Director then must approve your request for it to be an excused absence; otherwise an unapproved absence will affect your grade. The only excused absences after that date will be as follows: funerals or extreme medical conditions. If a situation comes up, and you will have to miss or be late to a performance, you must contact the Band Director immediately. Do not wait until the last minute. Most problems can be solved. Make sure to give enough time to allow that to happen. Work, babysitting, being grounded are examples of non-acceptable excuses.

There will be two required fundraisers during the year. Tiller Days during the fall semester and the Winterguard Competition during the spring semester. Each student will be required to work hours during these events. One shift will be required during Tiller Days and one shift on the day of the Winterguard Competition. Failure to do so will result in -5 points each.

If you miss(ed) a performance you will have to fill out a pink absence form. If you know about the missed performance before the performance, the pink form must be turned in as soon as you know you are going to miss. If you miss a performance at the last second, you will have two (2) day to turn in the form if you would like to make it up. Turning in the forms at the end of the season will not allow you to make up the missed performance.

### **Attendance and Participation**

Marching Band is a class and students receive credit for the class, however it is not set up to exist like the traditional academic class. In a math class or English class the student’s attendance is not critical to the success of the performance of the class. It is critical for a student’s own success but not for the group’s success. In a performance class, attendance is very critical to the success of the program. All of the students are part of a “picture” that will create a complete show. You run into staging difficulties and throw the production off if there is an attendance problem.

Due to the amount of music, drill, and/or cleaning we do during each rehearsal, if you miss a rehearsal and are unable to learn the changes you will not be performing at the next performance. If you miss the rehearsal right before the performance it is usually not possible to make the changes needed. If you are not able to perform at the performance, you will still have to go as well as make up the performance. Work, babysitting, being grounded are examples of non-acceptable excuses.

Attendance and participation in class is worth 50% of your overall grade. You will be given 100 points at the beginning of the semester. Students will lose points for the following reasons:

Being tardy	-2
Being very tardy (10 minutes or more)	-2 to -5 points
Leaving before you are excused	-2 to -5 points
Inappropriate behavior	-2 to -5 points
Inappropriate dress	-1 to -5 points

An excused missed rehearsal (with make-up assignment)	-0 points
An unexcused missed rehearsal	-10 points
Talking during rehearsal (per infraction)	-1 Point
Chewing Gum	-1 Point
Not having supplies (Music, Pencil, etc.)	-1 Point
Use of electronic devices (cell phones, iPods, etc.)	-1 Point

There can be other reasons to lose points as well. There is no way to address every scenario. Use your best judgment. It is possible to have negative points.

If you miss(ed) a rehearsal you will have to fill out a green absence form. If you know about the missed rehearsal before the rehearsal, the green form must be turned in as soon as you know you are going to miss. If you miss a rehearsal at the last second, you will have two (2) day to turn in the form if you would like to make it up. Turning in the forms at the end of the season will not allow you to make up the missed rehearsal.

### **Fundraising**

General Funds – The general fund is the responsibility of the Instrumental Booster Club. It costs about \$35,000 to run this program every year. We need everyone’s help to raise this money. The Booster’s Treasurer will provide monthly updates of the general fund at every booster meeting. If you have any questions regarding the budget, or would like to see it, please contact the Band Director.

### **Hair/Make-up/Jewelry**

We are a Marching Band and are in uniform. Uniform means the same. These expectations below are to make sure one student is not a distraction to the judges and audience.

Hair – During marching season hair is to be kept at a natural hair color for performances. Hair may be dyed, but needs to be a natural (or pretty close) color. If you hair is dyed to an unnatural hair color you could be a distraction to the judges and the audience. If your hair is dyed and it is determined that it will be a distraction you may be told you are not able to perform and as such your grade will be affected.

Make-up – There is to be no make on while you are wearing your band uniform. There is no need for it and it could damage the uniform.

Jewelry – There is to be no jewelry on while you are wearing your band uniform. There is no need for it and it could be a distraction. All visible body piercings need to be removed. Putting a Band-Aid over it is not good enough.

### **Bus Rules**

We use the bus many different times throughout the year. We want to make sure that the bus drivers look highly upon the Tustin High School Instrumental Program. All noise making devices must have the volumes turned off or you may use earphones. There should be no music playing on the bus. The bus will enter the silent zone when we are about 5 minutes from our destination. All electronic devices must be turned off and put away at this time. This is to be observed on all bus trips. Do not change seats while the bus is in motion unless authorized by the parent chaperone. Do not spray ANYTHING on the bus, including perfume. Show proper respect to chaperones, drivers, and all student leaders at all times. Pick up all trash when the trip is over BEFORE getting off the bus. No PDA on the bus.

### **Taping Equipment**

You are responsible to make sure your equipment it properly taped before all rehearsals and performances. If you have not been taught to tape your equipment, it is

your responsibility to make sure you learn from a senior member. Not knowing how to do something is not an excuse.

### **Early Dismissal or Late Arrival at Performances**

Anyone needing to arrive late or leave early from an organized music group activity (i.e. performance, football game, or competition) must bring a note from his/her parent to the Band Director at least one week before the event. This note should contain the following: student name, parent name, date written, date of performance, reason, and the name of the person picking up the student (must be at least 21 years old and on the contact list on the student's Aeries account). The student will not be dismissed to an unauthorized adult, unauthorized sibling, or boy/girl friend. Anyone becoming ill during a performance should contact a chaperone and the Band Director. All students are expected to stay at the competition with us and ride the home. The only reason the student should leave early is because of an event they need to go to. This is a team and we should all be together and support each other.

There will be no exceptions to this policy. No student will ever be able to drive themselves to an organized performance when everyone else takes the bus.

All Students are expected to ride the bus to all events. If there is a special reason why you are not able to ride the bus to an event the Band Director must be told immediately. Most requests will be denied. Students are less prepared when they do not meet at school and ride the bus to events. If a student meets us at a competition without prior approval that students will lose points and may not be able to perform. The student may also be sent home since they are not technically on the trip with us. This will be counted as a missed performance and their grade will be affected accordingly.

### **Grade Expectations**

The class you are taking is a class that requires rehearsals and performances outside of the normal school day. Because of this, it will take more time than a normal class. I will be checking every students' grades every quarter to determine that they are maintaining their grades. The expectation is that there are no F's and no more than 1 D. If a student falls below the expectations, they will be put on probation.

Probation 1 – This is your first semester on probation. You will not be allowed to participate in Winterguard or Drumline.

Probation 2 – This is your 2<sup>nd</sup> consecutive semester falling below grade expectation. You will not be allowed to participate in Marching Band, Drumline, or Winterguard.

Dropped – This is your 3<sup>rd</sup> consecutive semester falling below the grade expectation. You will be removed from the instrumental music program. You may rejoin if you have 2 consecutive semesters without any D's or F's.

### **Dropping Guard**

If a situation comes up where you want or need to drop guard, you need to wait until the end of the semester/season. Once auditions are done, you are a member of the group. If you drop guard after that date you will not be welcomed back to any instrumental music class at Tustin High School and will be removed from any other ensembles. Colorguard commitment is from August (auditioned date) to the end of November. Winterguard is from December to April.

### **Video Taping Performances**

If your parents want to video tape the performance they are usually allowed to do so. A couple points:

- Please be aware where you are standing. Make sure you are nowhere near the judges and make sure you are not standing up and blocking anyone around you.
- Some competitions do not allow you to video tape. If you are videotaping we could receive a penalty. Listen to announcements and look at signs, and if they say do not video tape, do not video tape.
- The performances we do are involving music. We own the copyright to play this music, but you do not own the rights to video tape and distribute the product (YouTube). This is called synch rights and they are very expensive. Do not put yourself in a situation to get sued. If you are going to post the video on YouTube, make it private. That way anyone you want to see it can view the link but no one else can. Music companies have people that go looking on YouTube for copyright violations. This includes pep music.
- Since we are a competition group, it is best if no one else sees our performances. It is to our benefit not to post videos for anyone to see. I often go online to look for performances of other groups we are competing against. Don't help the other groups out.

### **Pictures and Likeness**

This is a performance group. We have many performances outside of the school day. At many of the performances there is often a photographer taking pictures of the group. Your child may have their picture taken and posted on our website or an outside website. We have no control on who they post on an outside website or on any promotional material. We are not able to opt out of it. Because of this, if your child performs with our group, you are giving your permission to have their picture posted online. If there is a picture that you do not like on our website, please email and as long as it is not a group picture I will remove it.

### **Competition Warm-up Area**

Warm-up areas at competitions are just for that, warm-ups. We need a few parents to help get the students water and help with any other problems what come up. If a parent is not signed up or is not asked to help in warm-up we ask that they stay away. Younger siblings and alumni are not permitted in warm-up areas.

### **Code of Conduct**

Because our performing organizations represent our school, it is necessary for the welfare of the school to have each member be on their best behavior at all times. To encourage the highest expectations and respect for the school, family, and the organization you perform in, the Instrumental Music Department Staff at Tustin High School will expect all performers to abide by the following:

- Always demonstrate appropriate behavior at all times
- Display a positive attitude
- Follow all school rules and regulations
- Do not smoke, use drugs, alcohol, or use profane language
- Respect the director, instructors, parent volunteers, and student leaders in rehearsals and performances and use proper etiquette at all times
- Be aware of the dates, times, and events which are taking place and notify parents, employers and others concerned regarding these dates, times, and events
- Support the group by participating in all fundraising activities
- Be on time for all specified events at or away from school

- Always attend and perform to the best of your ability in rehearsals and performances
- Attend all rehearsals and performances unless there is a death in the family or a serious illness of the member as documented by a doctor's note
- Have your instrument in playing condition at all times
- Do not post any negative comments about any other student or group at Tustin High School on any social media or internet posts
- Do not post any negative comments about any other school's performing ensembles on any social media or internet posts
- Be professional in group texts used for school purposes.

### **Communication With Families**

Booster Meetings – These meetings are held once a month in the Tustin High School Instrumental Room. They are usually held on the first Wednesday of every month at 7:00PM. The dates are listed on the website. In addition to conducting the business of the Instrumental Music Organization, information is given about upcoming events and activities, and the Band Director will be available for questions. These meetings are open to everyone who has a student in the Tustin High School Instrumental Music Department, and all parents are encouraged to attend.

E-mail - Email addresses of all students and parents will be requested at the beginning of the year. This will be the primary form of contact by the director. This is an easy way to stay informed and everyone is encouraged to participate.

Music Students - Information will be given to each student throughout the year. Most of the information given to the students will also be emailed to parents; however, the students are going to be responsible for bringing home some information to the parents that is not sent by email.

Website – Most information that is given to students or distributed at a booster meeting will be available on the website. All calendars and up to date news will also be on the website. Please bookmark it and check it often. [www.tustinhsmusic.com](http://www.tustinhsmusic.com)

### **Other Important Information and Rules**

Communication – Most misunderstandings occur when students are not communicating their needs effectively to their parents or me. Please inform me of any problems as soon as possible. I do understand that students' and parents' lives are busy and hectic. Please allow me the chance to help you resolve any conflicts. Finding out about a problem after the fact will be a mutual point of frustration and possibly cause your grade to be lowered. We will be utilizing the website for the primary form of communication. I am available almost every snack and lunch for extra help for the students. Most of the time, problems can be solved within 15 minutes of one-on-one time.

Donation Information – **Dear Student:** The Constitution of the State of California requires that we provide a public education to you free of charge. Your right to a free education is for all school/educational activities, whether curricular or extracurricular, and whether you get a grade for the activity or class. Subject to certain exceptions, your right to a free public education means that we cannot require you or your family to purchase materials, supplies, equipment or uniforms for any school activity, nor can we require you or your family to pay security deposits for access, participation, materials, or equipment. Under certain circumstances, students involved in extracurricular programs, clubs and/or sports may be required to attend fundraising events held by the program, sport or club just as you may be required to attend any other event put on by that

program, club or sport. However, you will not be required to raise funds as a condition of participation.

Electronics – Students may not use a cell phone or any electronic devices during school, in the classroom, and during rehearsals without permission from the director. Students may not record any part of a class rehearsal in any media for any reason without my written permission and review (no verbal permission will be granted). However, students are encouraged to have a cell phone on their person for after school activities and performances. Furthermore, students are encouraged to enter a phone number under “ICE” (in case of emergency) in their contacts.

Back Door – At no point during the school day is the back door to be opened for any reason. If you open the back door, you will be given detention. Please do not ask to have something dropped at the back door.

Picking up students after rehearsals and performances – All rehearsals will end at the time specified. No rehearsal will go over. Please plan to pick up your child within 15 minutes after the rehearsal is scheduled to be over. I will be leaving 15 minutes after the rehearsal is over. If you have not picked up your child by that time, they will be encouraged to go wait at the front of the school. No supervision will be provided after the first 15 minutes.

After all performances, please plan to show up when we are scheduled to arrive. With almost all students having cell phones, it is much easier to let parents know if there are any changes to the schedule.

Forms – There will be different times throughout the year when the students are going to be given forms to fill out and a return deadline will be given. Please make sure that all forms are turned in on or before the deadline. Students will be given classroom detentions if the forms are turned in after the deadline. It takes a lot of work to put the forms in order and to track down the students that did not turn it in yet. Please do not be that student.

Writing on the Board – Please refrain from writing or erasing anything on the whiteboard or blackboard without permission from the Band Director. The information on the board is important to everyone and should not be messed with.

Friends in the Band Room – As much as I want your friends to see how band works and to hang out in the band room with you, it does not work well.. With all of the equipment in the band room, it is much easier to not have anyone in the room during the day besides music students. Please ask your friends to wait outside if you are going in the band room. If one of your friends would like to talk to me about band, they are more than welcome to come in and talk to me.

Hats and Sweater Hoods – At no time when you are in the band room may you wear a hat, sweater hood, beanie, or anything else on top of your head. It affects the sound that you hear when you are playing. Get in the habit of taking it off when you enter the room.

Contacts – If you have any questions throughout the year, please feel free to contact me at anytime.
